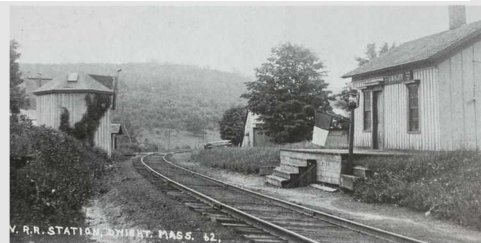
## CELEBRATING OUR ROOTS

Dear Friends,

Spring is here, and with the change of the season our thoughts turn to the exciting spring and summer events at the Stone House—a truly busy place, filled with momentum and activity in all aspects of our mission; it is exciting to be part of such a vibrant organization! Over the winter a lot has been happening with regards to the maintenance and preservation of our Museum, our finances, and of course, the social life of the Association, and we pause now to look back on all the important work members of the Association have been doing during the long winter months, and to consider the current state of our Association.

As we begin a new year with Opening Day on May 11, planning for our wonderful, almost-monthly events that give a rhythm to our Association's year are underway! Our cocktail party, ice-cream social, the Fair, Halloween event, in-person Yuletide, and Murder Dinner and the personal contacts that go along with them are annual milestones in our lives, and we are appreciative of the Trustees and volunteers who have pitched in and pushed so we can regain the momentum of all these events. We are also excited by two new events this year:

**Dwight Day**, will be held on Saturday, June 15 at Dwight Station, and will celebrate with lectures and activities the life of that historic section of Belchertown, and the Stone House will sponsor a **Living History Day** on Saturday, September 14, which will serve as our commemoration of the beginning of the anniversary of the War of Independence, and will feature reënactors in period costumes and traditional craft demonstrations.

Over the winter much work has been done by the Museum and Fundraising Committees, all of whom have worked tirelessly in their respective areas to make sure that the museum will be on a firm footing for the coming season. In particular, the Museum Committee continues to devote an **incredible amount of energy and work** to restoring the interior of the house, and to give it a much-needed facelift—and preparing for the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year of the construction of the Stone House in 2027!

Period-appropriate wallpapers and repairing plaster are only the beginnings of the work that has been going on, and it's very exciting to see this amount of energy in the house. At the museum, the trim repair and exterior painting of house and barn is almost complete, and repairs to the chimney have been long overdue; next will be a new picket fence, and the removal of the tree stump out front. We are thankful to Trustee **Sally Shattuck** for all she has done to coordinate these projects.

At the Washington District Schoolhouse, work is continuing on the interior of the building; we are building a storage room and installing interior stairs to the basement, and the installation of electricity is still

## Opening Day at the Museum: May 11th—Please join us!



The Belchertown Historical Association is holding its Opening Day activities at the Stone House Museum on Saturday, May 11<sup>th</sup> from 9-2. Visitors will be able to tour the house free of charge while viewing the many new renovations to the interior of the house. **This year's displays focus on "Crossroads"**. Belchertown played an integral part in the carriage manufacturing business, hosted two large hotels on the common as well as an inn. Trains came through town several times a day bringing visitors from the cities as well as travelers from across neighboring states. Travelers could then ride by carriage down to the lakes where they could stroll and enjoy the cooler temperatures. Exhibits throughout the museum and out buildings will showcase examples of carriages, clothing, luggage, maps, and photographs.

in progress. This whole process is extremely complicated, and we continue to be extremely grateful to **Bill Austin** for all his help and guidance. We continue to need **help with fundraising**, as none of us is an expert in this. We are so grateful for the more than 100 people who have contributed to this project, but we still estimate that the whole project will cost about \$150,000 more than we have raised.

In terms of special fundraising, we have again printed a new program book this year, and will continue to proudly distribute our beautiful **fifth** annual (except during COVID) program booklet, which is now available. With guidance from **Mary Knight**, we have produced a very attractive booklet that describes our museum and annual events, with brief articles about new acquisitions and the resources at the Stone House. 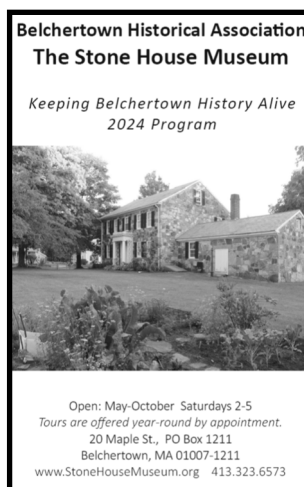

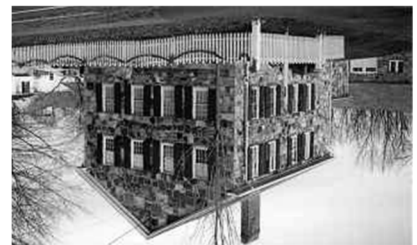
