### “One Horse Open Sleigh Returns Home to Belchertown”

The Trustees of the Belchertown Historical Association are pleased to announce the acquisition of a 19th century “One horse open sleigh” that was built in Belchertown by the firm of Hawks and Smith. The beautiful sleigh, in very good original condition and paint, has returned “home” just in time for the holidays, and has been moved to the Ford Annex carriage barn at Belchertown’s Stone House Museum.

We are so excited about our new acquisition! Many thanks to **Steve Boyko** for alerting us to the sale of this sleigh, to **Jim and Donna Boyko** for their very generous donation towards the purchase of the sleigh, and to **Steve Whitlock** for picking it up and transporting it for us!

### 1852 Hampshire County Map

We are also pleased to have acquired a Map of Hampshire County which, published in 1852, is earlier than the other maps we have. and has a detail of the center of Belchertown and several towns which are now under the Quabbin. It will likely be displayed in the Schoolhouse for all to see.



### “Uncle Sam Wants You”

Work has been completed by the New England Document Conservation Center, on our historic “Uncle Sam Wants You” WWI poster. We remember and thank the generosity of **Eleanor Schmidt**, as income from her trust has contributed toward these valuable additions to our collection.

Exciting news from our Museum is the new acquisition of two treasures:

An 1852 Map of Hampshire County. The map was published several years before the one we have in the Stone House, and has a detail of the center of Belchertown and several towns which are now under the Quabbin.

A 19th century one-horse open sleigh, made in Belchertown by Hawks, Smith & Company. The sleigh is an important survivor of Belchertown's thriving carriage industry. Many thanks to **Steve Boyko** for alerting us to the sale of the sleigh, and to **Steve Whitlock** for picking it up and transporting it for us! We continue to try to build our collection with important artifacts that will help us tell the story of Belchertown's past.

The board of trustees offers its thanks to all the members of the museum committee that spend many hours cleaning the house, setting up displays, cataloging new acquisitions, and giving tours to the public. These tasks require many hours of preparation and quite a bit of muscle power and energy in order to get the museum exhibits looking their best. The museum committee is looking for new members.
